Battery Collection Box

All types of batteries can be placed



- Lithium-ion batteries
- Power banks • Dry cells*
- Button cell batteries (LR, SR, PR)
- Coin cell batteries (CR, BR)*, etc.

*Dry cells and coin cell batteries can still be disposed of as non-burnables, just as before.


Small Rechargeable Batteries Recycling Box

Rechargeable batteries with the above symbols (NiCad, nickel-metal hydride, lithium-ion) and power banks are also collected at home appliance stores, home improvement stores, etc. Please refer to the JBRC (Japan Portable Rechargeable Battery Recycling Center) website for recycling box locations.

Small Home Appliance Recycling Box



- Portable gaming consoles • Electric shavers
- Handheld fans • Heat-not-burn cigarettes (e-cigarettes)
- Robot vacuums • Mobile phones • Smartphones
- Tablets • Laptops, etc.

- These are collected at ward offices, public facilities, etc.
- Please also use recycling collections available at home appliance stores and designated recyclers under the Small Appliance Recycling Act
