

Overview of Higashinada Ward



Higashinada Ward has developed as one of the leading residential areas in Kinki, with its easy access of 15 minutes to Sannomiya and 30 minutes to Umeda, and the environment surrounded by the sea and mountains. The population suffered a great deal of damage from the earthquake, and the population temporarily declined, but the population of the ward has exceeded that before the earthquake due to a series of new condominiums being built.

In the southern part of the ward, there are Uozaki-go and Mikage-go, which are among the five leading sake destinations in Japan. Even now, the brewery area where the factories of brewers are lined up has a unique atmosphere. The number of traditional wooden sake breweries has decreased, but there are museums of each manufacturer that show the state of sake brewing, and you can see people enthusiastically visiting the museum.



Universities are scattered in Yamate in the ward. It is attracting attention as a youth town where students gather around Hankyu Okamoto Station and JR Settsu-motoyama Station, and there are many fashionable cafes and general stores.



Offshore is Rokko Island, which was opened as a maritime cultural city. Although it is an artificially created island, the city is full of greenery and a relaxing time is flowing. In addition, foreign-affiliated companies are expanding and many foreigners live in it. Therefore, you can feel the international atmosphere in your daily life, such as seeing foreign language notation in the shops on the island.



In addition, Tonada has various faces such as a downtown area full of emotion, a seaside industrial area, and a city where traditional culture such as Danjiri lives. We hope that many people will be interested in Higashinada by visiting this site.
